Subject: Lake Isabella Plats - Isabella County

Per our conversation, I'm sending you a copy of the restrictions for Lake Isabella Golf Estates No. 2. It is my opinion the health department imposed restrictions can only be voided by an act of the health department. I would also add that Land Sales also has imposed those restrictions as part of their agreement. Per our understanding, Land Sales would not remove their restrictions without first getting health department approval. At this time, our office's position is no change with documentation to support a change.

I've also enclosed a recent letter from Broomfield Township regarding the new proposed plat. It appears from the letter from Broomfield Township that they are leaving the decision of sewers or on-site entirely to the health department. We have sent a letter to the developer listing the components needed to be included in a study to resolve the issue of sewers or septic.
